I served as *Vice-Chancellor (President)*, University of Ile-Ife (now Obafemi Awolowo University) from 1982 to 1989. The position of Vice-Chancellor is equivalent to that of a President in an American university. A Vice-Chancellor is the Chief Executive of a University in Nigeria. A person can occupy the office only for a maximum of seven years. The process for the appointment of a Vice-Chancellor begins with a nomination by the University faculty members. A joint committee of Council and Senate of the University prepares a short list of three candidates for the President of the country who would then appoint one of the three candidates to the position of Vice-Chancellor. All universities in Nigeria are owned by government both at Federal and State levels.
